John Townsend, PhD. This class examines: the utility and effects of biomedical and social-construction approaches to mental disorders; non-Western views and treatment of those labeled “mad;” cross-cultural distribution of mental disorders; legal, ethical, and medical implications of treatment modalities. Both cross-cultural variation and universals are explored in traditional cultures and modern nations, e.g., Africa, Mexico, Native Americans, Hutterites, Near East. First-person accounts are used to analyze the inner world of those labeled “mentally ill.”
