I asked Dr Robert Lenox (the Pulmonary/ Critical Care division chief) to tell us a little about the new pulmonary practice opening soon at Upstate University Hospital @ Community General. This is what he had to say:

It will probably be one to two months before it opens. This delay is because we have not solved all the computer problems (connecting everything there to here). We will have room for 2 attendings on any given day. We have hired an RN and a Medical Office Assistant. We will see all types of adult pulmonary and adult sleep problems at the office. The office will have the capability to do spirometry and we plan on giving omalizumab (Xolair-trademark) (anti-IgE antibody) injections at the office. The office will be located at 2 I in the north wing of the Community General POB. It will make it more convenient for patients from the west side to see us(ie.:Camillus, Marcellus, Auburn, Skaneateles, Moravia). Because the office is attached to the CG hospital bldg, it will be convenient for patients who need to have CTs and other tests and see us the same day. Bob



ONONDAGA CREEKWALK



Hiking the Inca Trail to Machu Picchu Peru, November 2011 (Article and photos compliments of W. Clay Elliott)

We flew to Cusco. That took 24 hours. One of my sons and I hiked to Machu Picchu on the Inca Trail. My wife, my other son and my 2 daughter's-in-law took the train from Cusco and joined us there. Camping is the only option on the Inca Trail. Our group consisted of the 2 of us, a guide, 2 cooks and 4 porters. We were very well cared for. The hike took 5 days of all day hiking at an elevation of 10,000-14,000 feet with lots of up and down (total elevation gain is 7000 feet). I found the hiking very challenging because I could not exert myself normally. Hypoxia (alveolar PO2 is 60 mm/Hg at 14,000 feet) slowed me down considerably. My pulse rate was continually 140-160/minute. The trail is very rocky, making downhills just as difficult. None of us had much of an appetite. We all got traveler's diarrhea. But the scenery was spectacular. This is a great trip, but challenging. EHR


