

National Poison Prevention Week is an annual event dedicated to raising awareness about the risks of poisoning and the steps people can take to prevent poisonings.

This observation, established by Congress in 1961, serves as a reminder of the importance of poison prevention and safety measures in our everyday lives. Throughout the week, educational programs, community outreach efforts, and legislative measures are organized. The goal of National Poison Prevention Week is to empower people with the knowledge and tools needed to keep themselves safe.

YOU can play an important role in poison prevention by taking simple, effective measures to protect your office, home, and your clients' homes:

- Store hazardous substances, such as cleaning supplies and medications, out of reach of children and pets. Consider using a medication lock box.
- Keep all products in original containers and read and keep the labels.
