CAREER SNAPSHOT

Respiratory therapists treat patients who have difficulty breathing because of illness or injury including heart failure, chest trauma, asthma, emphysema, cystic fibrosis, bronchitis, SIDS, near drowning, excessive bleeding and shock. Respiratory therapists use ventilators, medical gas, humidity, aerosols, intermittent positive pressure breathing (IPPB), bronchopulmonary drainage and exercises and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR).

Clinical settings include surgical and medical units, emergency rooms, outpatient departments, intensive care units (newborn, pediatric and adult), extended-care facilities, pulmonary function labs, homes, rehabilitation facilities, and rescue vehicles on the ground and in the air.
