Halloween Safety Tips

Halloween is Fun! To prevent any problems please follow the following tips:

-  Wear reflective clothing so that you can be seen at night.
-  Costumes should be made of fire-retardant material.
-  Children's costumes should not drag on the ground, this may cause them to trip.
-  Masks should not block vision.
-  Each person should carry a flashlight with new batteries.
-  Children should be reminded to stay with a group and no wander off alone.
-  Children should not accept rides from strangers or anyone who is not known by a parent or guardian
-  Always use a sidewalk and stay on well-lighted streets.
-  Do not carry lighted candles or lanterns with flames, they are a fire hazard.
-  Do not leave candles or jack-o-lanterns lit when you are not home.
-  Traffic laws and signals should be obeyed. Remind children not to run into the street or between parked cars.
-  Parents of young children should be reminded that small candy, peanuts can cause choking.
-  Make sure your pathway is well lighted.
