## **Bomb Threat Procedures**

This quick reference checklist is designed to help employees and decision makers **BOMB THREAT CHECKLIST:** of commercial facilities, schools, etc. respond to a bomb threat in an orderly and con- trolled manner with the first responders and other stakeholders. DATE: TIME: TIME CALLER HUNG UP: Most bomb threats are received by phone. Bomb threats are serious until proven otherwise. Act quickly, but remain calm and obtain information with the checklist on PHONE NUMBER the reverse of this card. WHERE CALL RECEIVED: If a bomb threat is received by phone: **ASK CALLER:** Remain calm. Keep the caller on the line for as long as possible. DO NOT HANG UP, even if the caller does. • Where is the bomb located? (building, floor, room, etc.) Listen carefully. Be polite and show interest. Try to keep the caller talking to learn more information. If possible, write a note to a colleague to call the authorities or, as soon as • When will it go off? the caller hangs up, immediately notify them yourself. If your phone has a display, copy the number and/or letters on the window • What does it look like? display. Complete the Bomb Threat Checklist immediately. Write down as much • What kind of bomb is it? detail as you can remember. Try to get exact words. Immediately upon termination of call, DO NOT HANG UP, but from a • What will make it explode? different phone, contact authorities immediately with information and await • Did you place the bomb?
