A phone call was sent out at 4:30 AM to all staff and faculty. Before 7 AM, the GME office had sent out a notice asking all residents hospital-wide to remain at work. Dr. Ajagbe assessed the situation, and Aubrey sent out the instructions for the internal Peds residency response moving residents from electives to the floors for their "all hands on deck" availability. While the rest of the world grappled with the chaos going on all around them, the Peds Dept (faculty, staff, residents, and chiefs) all took it in stride and most computers were up and running before the end of the day.

A special shout out to Chief Lauren, Chief Sloan, and Aubrey Mariani for the extra treats and Brooklyn Pickle run, to keep the troops fortified. And, again, thanks to all who were so flexible and were willing to help out in any way they could.

CEO Robert Corona, DO, MBA said that everyone who played a hand in the hospital's response "truly demonstrated how incredibly important the entire team is to the care of the region." Upstate's President Mantosh Dewan, MD, wrote, "All of campus is grateful for the quick action so many took beginning yesterday at the break of dawn to keep our clinical enterprise safe and operational. Thank you all for your dedication and commitment to this campus and our region." Chancellor John B. King, Jr., J.D., Ed.D. also sent a brief note "to thank you for your tremendous work during the global IT disruption caused by what was supposed to be a routine update from the cybersecurity company CrowdStrike...The challenge was vast and widespread, but your expertise, diligence, and dedication prevailed—downtime was minimized, and you found ways to continue to deliver high quality care for Upstate patients. I'm grateful for what you did and appreciate you!"
